WARC HEADS TO TIDY TOWNS

West Arnhem communities including Jabiru, Gunbalanya, Maningrida, Warruwi and Minjilang are all in the running to win at the 2018 Northern Territory Tidy Towns Awards.

West Arnhem Regional Council (WARC) has continued to be a leader in environmental sustainability over the years with Jabiru picking up numerous Tidy Towns awards and Maningrida winning the Litter Management Award (North) and the Geoff Finch Memorial Cup which is awarded to the 'Most Improved Community' in 2017.

Judging of all five communities has taken place over the last few weeks' with each community celebrating their collective efforts in the lead up to the Tidy Towns events.

The WARC works crew in Jabiru received letters of

appreciation from the Chief Executive Officer Heimo Schober of the Keep Australia Beautiful Council (NT) at the judging, for their efforts in maintaining a positive and rubbish-free atmosphere in the township.

"Picked up rubbish to assist to keep their country and people strong.."

This was followed by a barbecue and awards presentation which was supported by Jill Grant on behalf of the CEO of Keep Australia Beautiful Council (NT).

WÁRC Jabiru Services Manager Jerry Pena said the works team continue to do a great job with the tasks they undertake daily and should be proud of their efforts.

Meanwhile, WARC's Youth, Sport and Recreation team in Gunbalanya have worked with the young people in the community over the last few weeks to create awareness about littering and keeping a tidy town.

As part of the October school holidays, the youth spent a day doing the 'right thing' around the community and picked up rubbish to assist to keep their country and people strong.

The group sat down and discussed the Territory Tidy Towns program and what it means to the community, and the youth came up with their own meanings and desired outcomes for the program. This was used as a driving force to keep the youth inspired to continue making a positive change.

CONSTRUCTION IN GUNBALANYA

Minister for Housing and Community Development Gerry McCarthy visited Gunbalanya recently where five dwellings, including a duplex, are currently under construction.

These houses are the first of 12 new homes and one replacement home planned for Gunbalanya under the Territory Labor Government's \$1.1 billion 'Our Community. Our Future. Our Homes' record housing investment in remote areas.

Territory company SH Build has the building contract for the most recent works at Gunbalanya.

About 44 workers, including subcontractors and 12 Aboriginal employees have been involved in the jobcreating project to date.

Since coming to Government just over two years ago, ten new and replacement homes have been built and 54 have been upgraded in Gunbalanya.

Additionally, two new government employee houses have been built and six have been upgraded.

In remote areas across the Territory, a total of 241 homes have been built, nearly 700 have been upgraded and a further 120 homes across 22 communities have been extended and improved.

Member for Arafura Lawrence Costa said, "The Territory Labor Government is delivering jobs and housing and making a big difference to the Gunbalanya community.

"Housing has been an issue at the community for a long while but, thanks to our record investment in remote housing, we are seeing changes for the better.

"People at Gunbalanya have a sense of ownership over the new homes because they have been involved in the planning and construction."

The Northern Territory Government has approved more than \$3 million in new grants for Aboriginal Ranger programs that aim to create local jobs and deliver economic opportunities out bush.

Ranger groups have been allocated grants for a wide-range of work across the Territory, including monitoring turtles, dolphins, dugongs and mud crabs, and managing weeds, fire and feral animals.

Announcing the latest round of funding, Minister for Environment and Natural Resources Eva Lawler said Aboriginal Rangers provide a crucial frontline role in protecting country across vast areas.

"With more than 50 percent of the land and 85 percent of the coastline Aboriginal owned or managed the work by Aboriginal Rangers is vitally important for conservation, land management and cultural outcomes," she said.

There are more than 1,000 Rangers serving in 46 NT Aboriginal Ranger groups.

Under the Government's Protecting Country, Creating Jobs initiative, \$1,976,396 has been allocated under 2017-18 funding to 27 ranger groups for essential equipment and infrastructure, including Ranger bases, four-wheel drive vehicles, boats, all-terrain vehicles, spray units for weed and fire management, communications equipment and IT systems.

for 2017-18 to 22 projects under a Land Management and Conservation Fund to improve and develop conservation practices on Aboriginal land.

Applications for another round of grants under the NT's Aboriginal Ranger Grant Programs opened on 24 September 2018.

NATIVE PLANTS KEY TO SEED COLLECTION EFFORTS

Staff from Energy Resources of Australia (ERA) and Kakadu Native Plants Pty Ltd have been busy out collecting native seeds as part of the progressive rehabilitation of Ranger Project Area and the Jabiluka Mineral Lease.

The seeds will grow into the native trees and shrubs identified as suitable for planting onsite and will play an important role in providing fresh clean air, storing carbon, restoring biodiversity, and providing future habitat for wildlife.

ERA have provided assurances to stakeholders including the Mirarr people that rehabilitation will restore the environment consistent with the surrounding park and we have a team of world class rehabilitation and local experts helping us to keep that promise.

The partnership with local indigenous supplier Kakadu Native Plants Pty Ltd was formed in 2005 with the goal to propagate local seeds collected with a permit from the mine lease and within Kakadu National Park. By raising saplings from local seeds

PROGRAM SUPPORTS EMERGING LEADERS

The first meeting of the 2018 First Circles Leadership Program took place recently with 16 aspiring Aboriginal leaders from remote communities across the Territory gathering in Darwin for a two-day workshop.

The First Circles Leadership Program helps members expand their leadership skills, develop their professional profiles and both better contribute to and understand the impact of public policies and programs on their communities.

The program includes eight Aboriginal Territorians from the south of the NT, and eight from the north. Members meet with Cabinet and many go on to represent their community on a national platform. Minister for Education and Member for Arnhem, Selena Uibo, is a First Circles graduate.

Minister for Education Selena Uibo said, "As a former First Circles member, I valued the opportunity the program presented in focusing on solutions in our remote community.

"I would encourage those interested in the program to apply in the next intake as the skills, support and encouragement will be an exciting experience for an individual who wants to positively impact change in their community."

Minister for Aboriginal Affairs Ken Vowles said, "First Circles is a unique program that helps Aboriginal people from across the Territory find a voice. It helps ensure they are engaged and can confidently and directly speak to government about matters affecting their lives, families and communities."

the species had already proven themselves able to adapt and thrive in the unique Northern Territory landscape.

Over thousands of years these native tree species have evolved to adapt to the unique seasons of Kakadu from the monsoon in the wet season, fire in the dry, through to six months with no rain at all. Seed selection must also be culturally appropriate to the area as both the Jabiluka Mineral Lease and Ranger Project Area are located on Aboriginal land surrounded by, but separate from the UNESCO World Heritage-listed Kakadu National Park and hold important connections for the traditional owners of the region.

In consultation with the Mirarr people, more than 16,000 tube stock were planted at Jabiluka between 2005 and 2015, from 22 different native species including, Acacia, Eucalyptus, Corymbia and Terminalia.

ERA continues to undertake research and monitor the progression of the rehabilitation, learning from and adapting techniques. The monitoring has demonstrated resilience, good survival rates, and the return of other native flora and fauna.

ERA's long-term vision is to return the disturbed area to a viable ecosystem in line with its obligations to stakeholders and regulators, and the expectations of the community.



RANGERS JOIN FORCES TO BATTLE WILD FIRES

Jawoyn Rangers and Northern Territory Parks and Wildlife Rangers are hopeful conditions improve as they battle a wildfire raging on the Nitmiluk and Kakadu park boundaries, in the Northern Territory's mid-north.

The ranger groups have been working overtime with Bushfires NT and Kakadu National Park to contain the blaze, after it broke out over a week ago.

This fire is believed to have been deliberately lit.

Hot weather and high winds have fanned the flames, which has so far incinerated 10,000 hectares of bush in the Douglas Spring area.

More than 15 combined crew have been working day and night to prevent the blaze from spreading from the northern end of Nitmiluk National Park into Kakadu.

"This fire has forced all hands on deck," Jawoyn Rangers Land Manager Scott Herring said.

"Despite the tough conditions, the inter-agency coordination has been outstanding and we're all focused on stopping the fire from moving into Kakadu and

BOOSTING YOUTH PROGRAMS

The Territory Labor Government is investing in our youth and creating safer communities by providing grants through the 2019 Alcohol and Other Drugs Youth Grants Program.

Grants of up to \$20,000 each are available for community projects or initiatives aimed at preventing substance misuse by our Territory youth.

Applications must demonstrate how the proposed project relates to the National Drug Strategy 2017-2023 and the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples Drug Strategy 2014-2019 Northern Territory based

Northern Territory based incorporated organisations or community groups are eligible to apply.

Grants will be provided by the Northern Territory Government through the Department of Health's Mental Health, Alcohol and Other Drugs Branch.

A total of \$280,000 is available to be awarded this round.

Minister for Health, Natasha

Fyles said the Alcohol and Other Drugs Youth Grants Program delivers on the Territory Labor Government's promise to reinstate funding for activities aimed at reducing the impact of youth substance misuse.

These include; awareness raising and education projects for young people that promote healthy choices and activities, sporting, cultural and community events that young people's enhance level of connectedness that builds resilience, activities which support young people to develop skills and learn, and; projects that work with young people to reduce alcohol consumption during pregnancy and raise awareness about Foetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD).

onto the Arnhem Land plateau.

"We're lucky the wildfire hasn't put homes and lives in danger to date, but it's tough to see the Nitmiluk take such a battering."

Firefighting in remote areas takes special equipment, where crews have to cross tough terrain in vehicles or be flown in helicopters.

There are a number of 4WDs, a water tanker, grader and one helicopter working at the fire front.

Northern Territory Parks and Wildlife Ranger Aaron Ledgard says the crew are putting in a mammoth effort.

"It's vital we work together as fires this wild do major damage to the environment," Mr Ledgard says.

"This is also the second year of our carbon farming program in Nitmiluk and we want to limit the loss of carbon credits as a result of the fire."

With the build-up weather refusing to show signs of cooling down, the joint forces are expecting to continue fighting the blaze through the week.
