This year, Kurrung Sports Carnival will take place on 1 and 2 September and will feature a men's AFL competition, men's and women's basketball and for the first time, a women's AFL 9s contest. With the growing interest in women's football in the region, this is an exciting addition to the carnival's program and Council looks forward to showcasing this

new sport following the opening ceremony on the Friday afternoon.

# NEW EXCAVATOR SUPPORTS ADDITIONAL SERVICE DELIVERY

West Arnhem Regional Council's works team in Minjilang are thrilled with the newest piece of machinery on the island. The new 1.8t excavator was purchased by Council through the Northern Territory Government's Immediate Priority Grants (IPG) program, and will be put to great use supporting the delivery of Council's municipal services within the community. As Minjilang is an island community, it is really important for Council to be self-sufficient and prepared to fulfil all operations relating to parks and gardens, roads and waste.

Council also has an important role to play in maintaining community safety in relation to disaster preparedness.

Since there was an engine failure in Minjilang's backhoe there was no machinery which could undertake excavation works, so the new excavator is a much needed asset within the fleet which allows great capacity for our team. The new machinery also provides further training and development opportunities for our team on the ground.

# RECORD FUNDING ON OFFER FOR ABORIGINAL RANGER GRANTS

The Northern Territory Government, in partnership with the INPEX-led Ichthys Joint Venture, is providing opportunities for Aboriginal rangers and improving the environment.

There is a \$6 million dollar funding pool in Round 7 of the Aboriginal Ranger Grants Program, which opens for applications on July 31st.

\$4.5 million of the funding comes from the Territory Labor Government's Protecting Country, Creating Jobs commitment, established in 2017 to address underresourcing of Ranger groups.

resourcing of Ranger groups.
While \$1.5 million will come from the Ichthys Offset program, to support outcomes related to species listed in their Coastal Offset Strategy - including dugong, dolphins, whales, marine

turtles, and seabirds, and their habitats. The previous six rounds of the Land Management and Conservation Fund (now Land and Sea Management Fund) have delivered or committed more than \$10million to 28 Ranger groups across the Territory.

An independent review in 2021, by Ninti One found the Aboriginal Ranger Grants program had made a considerable and profound contribution to land management across the Northern Territory, with substantial outcomes and financial benefits achieved.








### **5 DIMENSIONS OF RECONCILIATION**

Reconciliation Australia's vision of reconciliation is based and measured on five dimensions: historical acceptance; race relations; equality and equity; institutional integrity and unity.

These five dimensions do not exist in isolation, but are interrelated. Reconciliation cannot be seen as a single issue or agenda; the contemporary definition of reconciliation must weave all of these threads together. For example, greater historical acceptance of the wrongs done to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples can lead to improved race relations, which in turn leads to greater equality and equity.

#### Race Relations

All Australians understand and value Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non-Indigenous cultures, rights and experiences, which results in stronger relationships based on

trust and respect and that are free of racism.

### Institutional Integrity

The active support of reconciliation by the nation's political, business and community structures.

#### Equality **And Equity**

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples participate equally in a range of life opportunities and the unique rights of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples are recognised and upheld.

### Unity

An Australian society that values and recognises Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures and heritag as a proud part of a shared

# BÁBBARRA PRINTED TEXTILES GRACE CDU GALLERY

Charles Darwin University's Art Gallery will (CDU) be teeming with bold and colourful hand-printed textiles this month, with the launch of new exhibition Manburrba: our story of printed cloth from Bábbarra Women's Centre. The exhibition celebrates the creative journey undertaken by Maningrida women over the past 37 years, featuring more than 85 striking and colourful hand-printed textiles made by 24 artists, as well as limited edition prints-onpaper, sculptures and basketry. It is the first major survey exhibition of Bábbarra's textile printmaking to be held in the Northern Territory. Bábbarra Women's Centre artist Raylene Ngarridjdjan Bonson said her artwork in Manburrba exhibition highlights three generations of textile artists in her family. "I feel happy to see my mum's printed textile featured in Manburrba exhibition," the Bonson Ms said. "I printed the lino-block print Marebu (pandanus mat) on behalf of my mother. I hope it inspires Rosanna, my eldest

daughter to print for me." Gallery CDU Art and exhibition curator Dr Joanna Barrkman said this partnership rekindles connections from more than 25 years ago, when the University was active in introducing limited-edition printmaking techniques to artists in Maningrida. "It has been an honour to partner with Bábbarra Women's Centre to curate this exhibition over eighteen months with the stunning textiles produced by this innovative group of women," Dr Baarkman said. "Workshops in lino-block printing and etching were delivered at Bábbarra Women's Centre in 1998-99. The *Manburrba* exhibition charts the terrain covered by the artists since that time."

Manburrba is the word for cloth in the Kuniniku language of Arnhem Land. As one of Australia's major First Nations textile enterprises, Bábbarra Women's Centre has fostered the technique of printing on cloth for many years, with their reputation for large-scale, repeat, screenprinted textiles spanning Australia and the globe. prints "Bábbarra's and textiles have been widely exhibited, nationally and internationally, in cities such as Los Angeles, Kolkata, Paris and Sydney," she said. "Textile art has emerged as the creative medium to achieve improved economic livelihoods for three generations of Maningrida's women, while also enabling them to maintain, transmit and express their cultural practices and expand their creativity on Country." # PROTECT YOURSELF AGAINST JAPANESE ENCEPHALITIS

Japanese encephalitis (JE) is caused by the Japanese encephalitis virus. Encephalitis is inflammation of the brain tissue and is usually caused by an infection. The virus is spread through mosquito bites.

Infection in humans is most commonly asymptomatic.

On rare occasions, it can result in severe disease with brain damage and even death.

### How it is spread

JE is spread by the bite of an infected mosquito. It cannot be spread from person to person.

In countries or regions where the virus is present, the transmission is more common in areas of increased mosquito activity.

Pigs and wild water birds help spread the virus. It multiplies in infected pigs, leading to very high levels in their blood.

Mosquitoes feeding on infected pigs and water birds pick up the virus and may spread it to humans.

Symptoms

It usually takes 5 to 15 days between getting bitten by the infected mosquito and becoming unwell.

Symptoms include:

- headaches
- fever
- seizures or fits (especially in young children)
- neck stiffness
- drowsiness
- confusion, delirium and coma in severe cases.

#### **Treatment**

There are no specific treatments for JE. In most cases, individuals are admitted to hospital where they are closely observed and given supportive care.

### How to protect yourself

There are 2 ways to prevent JE:

- avoid being bitten by mosquitoes
- there is a vaccination. There is currently a limited supply of JE vaccines. If you're a Northern Territory (NT) resident you may be eligible to receive a free vaccine.

In preparation for National Child Protection Week, West Arnhem Regional Council's Youth, Sport and Recreation program had some great discussions about what gives our kids a sense of belonging and safety at home.

Common themes were family, friends, school and country. After a brainstorming session everyone created an art work that represented this feeling.
