REMOTE HOUSING MILESTONE

One hundred homes have been built in one hundred days as the Territory Labor Government's remote housing program reaches a new milestone of 1200 new builds.

Families from 20 communities have recently moved into brand new homes in communities from the northeast island of Galiwin'ku, through Jilkminggan and Kalkarindji, down to Amoonguna in the south.

Several major construction contracts have powered a building blitz with a pipeline of works rolling out across dozens of remote communities throughout the Territory, such as a \$26.5 million tender recently released in Gunbalanya to build 24 new homes and upgrade another 18, \$5.2 million for 11 homes in Beswick, and \$6.8 million for more homes in Maningrida.

New data highlights the concerted efforts of the Northern Territory and Australian Governments to deliver new homes, extensions and upgrades in remote communities over the past quarter.

The current program is jointly funded by the Northern Territory and Australian Governments through the \$2.2 billion Remote Housing Investment Package Our Community. Our Future. Our Homes.

Since coming to Government in 2016, the Territory Labor Government has built and improved nearly 3000 remote homes.

Chief Minister Natasha Fyles said, "We came to Government with a clear agenda to improving remote housing across the Territory."

"This milestone of one hundred homes built in one hundred days shows just how determined we are to achieve our goal."

"Local decision making is at the core of the planning, designing and construction process and this has encouraged remote community residents to be involved every step of the way from planning and

design to allocation."

Minister for Housing and Homelands Selena Uibo said, "I am really proud of the progress we have made in delivering homes to Territorians in our remote communities."

"The ongoing work not only makes a huge difference to the many families who finally have a home to call their own, it has provided local businesses with contracts running several years, and created opportunities for Aboriginal Territorians to complete formal training including certificates and apprenticeships."

"These opportunities benefit everyone and help to create sustainable communities."

NEW ADDITIONS TO WARC FLEET

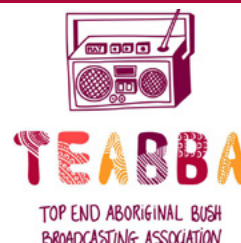
West Arnhem communities have recently acquired some new additions to the fleet to assist with service delivery!

LET'S PREPARE OUR REGION FOR CYCLONE SEASON

As we move into cyclone season there are things we can all do to prepare and keep yourself, your family and your home safe. A few helpful tips from NT Police, Fire & Emergency Services <https://secure.nt.gov.au/>

Trim tree tops and branches well clear of your home

- Clear your property of loose material that could blow about and possibly cause injury or damage during extreme winds
- In case of a storm surge/tidal warning, or other flooding, know your nearest safe high ground and the safest access route to it
- Prepare an emergency kit that can sustain every member of the household for at least 72 hours.

Council will be undertaking pre-cyclone clean-ups across all of our communities so community members can dispose of any hard rubbish that may become a risk in the cyclone season.

As Council staff members please spread the word around our communities and help your colleagues, family and neighbours stay safe this cyclone season. Keep an eye out on the WARC Facebook and the Wire for you communities dates.

EMERGING ABORIGINAL LEADERS CALLED TO JOIN FIRST CIRCLES 2023 PROGRAM

The Territory Labor Government supports the ground-breaking First Circles Program, which cultivates the next generation of Aboriginal leaders.

The program is now open to expressions of interest from Aboriginal Territorians who want to be part of next year's program. Supporting this unique program is one of the ways the Territory Labor Government is enhancing strong Aboriginal leadership, governance and capacity, which is fundamental to Aboriginal Territorians driving local solutions and leading the way in local decision making.

First Circles Members will attend four workshops in 2024 and be mentored and supported by staff and previous members whilst in the program.

The year-long series of intensive

workshops culminate in the group addressing all Ministers in the Northern Territory Government Cabinet.

Successful applicants will be invited to attend the Aboriginal Leadership and Governance Forum to be held in Alice Springs in 2024.

The current 2023 program includes 27 members who have attended the First Circles workshops and are scheduled to complete the program in October 2023.

Managed through the Department of the Chief Minister and Cabinet's Aboriginal Affairs Strategic Partnerships Team, since it started in 2014 over 100 Aboriginal leaders have been part of the program.

Many members go on to represent their community on a national platform. Minister for Aboriginal Affairs, Member for Arnhem Selena Uibo, is a First Circles graduate.

The program is a key element of the Territory Labor Government's commitment to the Aboriginal Affairs Strategy, including local decision making, closing the gap and ensuring Aboriginal Territorians' social and economic aspirations are being met.

Expressions of interest applications for the 2024 program close on 30 November 2023.

WEED MANAGEMENT UNDER WAY IN MANINGRIDA

Maningrida is currently in full weed management mode attacking Mission grass and other noxious weeds in the township before the wet season arrives. We have met with the local Rangers to coordinate our efforts around town.

We are identifying Mission grass locations and then spraying the areas with a dyed chemical and on the following day our works crews are cutting, gathering and burning the weeds on site. We are burning on site instead of transporting to the landfill to restrict potential weed spread.

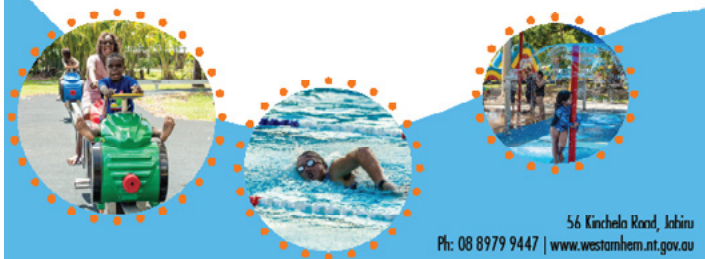

PROTECT YOURSELF AGAINST JAPANESE ENCEPHALITIS

Japanese encephalitis (JE) is caused by the Japanese encephalitis virus. Encephalitis is inflammation of the brain tissue and is usually caused by an infection. The virus is spread through mosquito bites.

Infection in humans is most commonly asymptomatic.

On rare occasions, it can result in severe disease with brain damage and even death.

How it is spread

JE is spread by the bite of an infected mosquito. It cannot be spread from person to person.

In countries or regions where the virus is present, the transmission is more common in areas of increased mosquito activity.

Pigs and wild water birds help spread the virus. It multiplies in infected pigs, leading to very high levels in their blood.

Mosquitoes feeding on infected pigs and water birds pick up the virus and may spread it to humans.

Symptoms

It usually takes 5 to 15 days between getting bitten by the infected mosquito and becoming unwell.

Symptoms include:

- headaches
- fever
- seizures or fits (especially in young children)
- neck stiffness
- drowsiness
- confusion, delirium and coma in severe cases.

Treatment

There are no specific treatments for JE. In most cases, individuals are admitted to hospital where they are closely observed and given supportive care.

How to protect yourself

There are 2 ways to prevent JE:

- avoid being bitten by mosquitoes
- there is a vaccination.

There is currently a limited supply of JE vaccines. If you're a Northern Territory (NT) resident you may be eligible to receive a free vaccine.
